Announcement

GLISS EXTRA 2025 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2024, the ISU Constitution 2025, the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2024, and all relevant ISU Communications, as well as the technical requirements of the Estonian Skating Union for the season 2025/2026. The ISU Judging System shall be used in all categories.

All information will be available on the Organizer's website www.tvuk.eu.

- The Organizers shall have the right to split categories if the number of participants requires them to do so.

- The Organizers shall have the right to combine categories if the number of participants requires them to do so.

REGISTRATION OF ENTRIES

Entries can only be made through the club. Each **club** has the right to enter up to 3 (three) competitors in any category and class. In case a club wishes to enter more skaters, those skaters can be registered on a waiting list. However, the Organiser reserves the right to limit the number of skaters from the invited clubs. Entries must be submitted in a written form (see Entry form), and the Organizer will send a confirmation. Please provide your contact information (e-mail, phone) on the entry form.

All Entries must be done through the **Sportity Online Registration System**: <https://fs.sportity.com>. The deadline for entries is **October 6, 2025**.

IMPORTANT: All Members who are entering competitors for the first time into the **Sportity Online Registration System** must contact **Sportity Ltd. by email info@sportity.com** with the Members' (Clubs) Country, Organisation Legal Name, National Registry code, and contact e-mail address. Please ensure you have enough time to create an initial account. The process might take up to 24 hours.

ENTRY FEE (paid before October 9, 2025):

Single Skating with one program:	90€
Single Skating with two programs:	110€
Pair skating with two programs:	120€

Late ENTRY FEE (paid after October 9):

Single Skating with one program:	100€
Single Skating with two programs:	120€
Pair Skating with two programs:	130€

Each club has to pay **100%** of the total amount for its participants **right after the entry form confirmation**, but not later than **October 9, 2025**.

The competitor is included in the entry list only after a 100% payment, and from that moment can only be substituted by another skater in the same category and class if an emergency cancellation occurs.

We kindly ask the clubs to make one payment for all their participants.

- All registration-related procedures (cancellation, changes) must be submitted to the organizer in written form as soon as possible, but no later than **October 20, 2025** to the e-mail: **glisseextra@gmail.com**.
- In case a skater has been entered in the competition, but cannot participate, she/he can be replaced by another skater in the same category and class.

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason, except when the Organizer has to reduce the entries.

AWARDING

Medals or trophies shall be awarded to the first three standings of each category/class. All competitors shall receive a diploma and a present at the awarding ceremony.

PROTESTS

A protest must be submitted in writing to the category referee. If the referee is not available, the protest should be submitted via email to the competition secretariat, who will forward it to the referee. (ISU Rule 123). A protest cannot be filed against the judgments of the referees, judges, or technical panel (technical controller, technical specialists) regarding the athlete's performance.

A protest regarding incorrect mathematical calculations must be submitted no later than 24 hours after the award ceremony for the respective competition. Errors in identifying an element or determining its level, even if they result in a change in the score, do not fall under the category of "arithmetic errors" or incorrectly entered elements. The recorded footage from the event organizers will be taken into account upon resolving the protest.

All protests (except for incorrect mathematical calculations) must be submitted no later than 30 minutes after the end of the respective segment. A protest can only be submitted by the athlete, the accredited team leader for the respective competition, or, with their consent, members of the organizing committee or clubs that registered the competitor.

The cost of submitting a protest is €50, which must be paid at the time of submission. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be refunded. Otherwise, the protest fee will remain with the competition organizer.

MUSIC & PLANNED PROGRAMS

The club is responsible for uploading their competitor's **Music and Planned Program Content** to the **Sportity Online Registration System**:
<https://fs.sportity.com> by **October 17, 2025** the latest.

Each music submission shall be labelled with the name of the country, name of the category, segment and the name(s) of the competitor(s).

Example:

- EST_Junior_Men_FS_Smith_John
- LAT_Senior_Women_SP_Maxwell_Max

The music files must be uploaded as WAV or MP3 file formats. Any other format is not acceptable.

Please note: *Files in MP3 format may have a significant difference in the music quality when reproduced. The Organizing Committee in this case is not*

responsible if the music quality is insufficient.

Each Competitor must have their own backup drive (USB Stick) for each program in the format of a WAV or MP3 file.

IMPORTANT! Clubs/Skaters are reminded that for them to use music to accompany their routines, the following 'Music Accompaniment' rights/licenses are required:

- the right to edit or adapt music into a mix, if more than one song is being used.
- the right to set choreography to the music, often referred to as a 'Grand Right', which is the right to perform musical compositions and recordings within the context of a "dramatic work" or choreography.
- the right to create any copies of the music that may be needed for training and competition purposes, also known as the 'mechanical rights'.

For music to be fully cleared for these uses, these rights need to be cleared for every track used in each mix that contains a license (backed by a warranty and legal indemnity) for appropriate territory(s) that covers both the master rights of the recording artist and the publishing rights of each individual writer and composer of the track.

RESPONSIBILITY

In accordance with the ISU constitution, Rule 119, all participants act at their own Responsibility.

THE CODE OF ETHICS

All officials (skaters, coaches, judges, chaperons) must follow the ISU Communication 2702.

JUDGES

Each participating club may nominate one judge of at least a National category to the Competition. In case of too many judge entries, the organizer will draw the panels of judges after the deadline.

Coaches are not allowed to act as Judges. In case a judge is sent by a club, the latter is responsible for the judge's transportation and accommodation expenses.

However, ***accommodation compensation*** in the amount of up to EUR 30 per night is available for invited judges upon the presentation of a hotel receipt (addressed to Uisuklubi Gliss MTÜ, Kotzebue 9-19). Invited Judges will also be granted with daily allowance.

Judge entries must be submitted by **October 6, 2025.**

TIME-SCHEDULE

The competition will start on Friday, October 31, 2025, and will end on Sunday, November 2, 2025. A schedule will be sent to all participating Members soon after the Entry deadline.

The schedule will be available in the Sportity app and on the Organizer's website www.tvuk.eu.

MANDATE

All participating clubs are asked to send their final entry forms for the draw **by October 30, 12 p.m.**

DRAWS

An ISU electronic draw shall be conducted on **October 30, at 4 p.m.**, to draw the starting orders of all categories.

STARTING ORDER

Starting orders will be available in the Sportity app at the Organizer's website www.tvuk.eu after the Electronic Draw.

In the categories with 2 programs, the starting order for the free program will be the reverse order of the result after the short program.

INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole responsibility of each Member participating in Gliss Extra 2025 to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means of the ill or injured person.

The Organizer takes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred in connection with Competitors and Officials.

PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA IN PUBLIC PLACES

Unless otherwise provided by law, upon making audio or visual recordings in public places, intended for future disclosure, the consent of data subjects shall be substituted by an obligation to notify the data subjects thereof in a manner which allows the persons to understand the fact of the recording of the audio or visual images and to give the persons an opportunity to prevent the recording of their person if they so wish. **The notification obligation does not apply in the case of public events, the recording of which may be reasonably presumed for disclosure.** (The Estonian Personal Data Protection Act, § 11).
